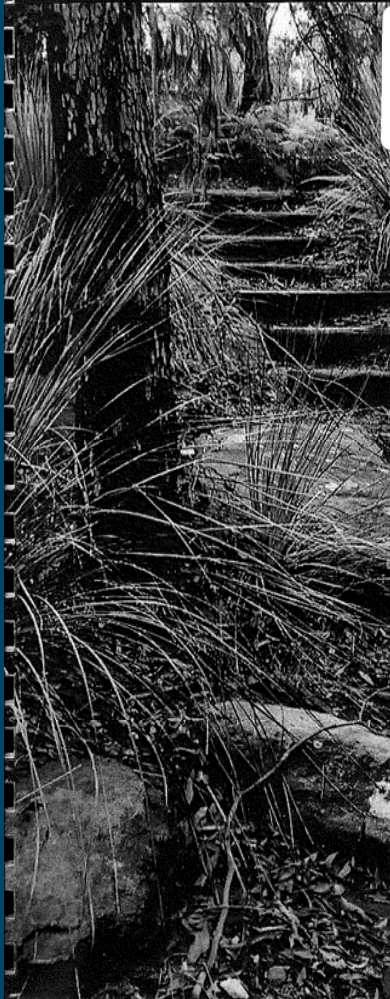


Existing Plan Achievements:

- Major land acquisitions into the Park: 372ha to approx. 700 ha.
- Weir / Jenkins Hall precinct upgrade
- Adoption and implementation of a Fire Management Strategy 2006 – 2010
- Commencement of a new Weed Management Strategy

Existing Plan Achievements:

- **Fish ladder installed at weir**
- **Parking Area Sugarloaf Point**
- **Signage and picnic facilities upgraded throughout the Park / & picnic areas closed**
- **Roads, fire trails and walking tracks upgraded**
- **Established recycling stations**
- **Boatshed restored**



Existing Plan Achievements:

- **Bush regeneration volunteers / groups increased – over 200 vols currently registered**
- **Number of corporate groups working within the Park increased significantly**
- **Sydney Metropolitan Wildlife Service commenced operating within the Park**
- **Joint management programs undertaken with Park neighbours / land managers**



Existing Plan Achievements:

- **High conservation bush regeneration program / TSM undertaken and continued**
- **Cultural and European heritage management undertaken and ongoing**
- **Installation of stormwater control devices at strategic locations**
- **Feral animal control programs undertaken, including intensive fox control**



Existing Plan Achievements:

- Old kiosk on the River removed
- Paddle Wheeler ceased operation
- Houses demolished River Avenue and returned to open space
- New Park brochure and education material
- Use of Kukundi Wildlife Shelter changed
- Pay and display visitor entry implemented
